


ABOUT ANGEL EARS:

Angel Ears began as a means of promoting humane education, adoption of rescue dogs and for the provision of supportive intervention by Registered Therapy Dogs to the community of children, disabled and the elderly. In 2006, several H.A.L.O. volunteers and their canine pals, all rescue dogs with stories of their own, committed to becoming registered therapy teams and R.E.A.D. trained.

Since that time, Angel Ears Reading Education Assistance Dog (R.E.A.D) teams have volunteered in eight East County libraries to work with children who can benefit in their quest to become better readers by having a four-pawed, furry, non-judgmental reading buddy. Angel Ears teams have provided their own warm 'n fuzzy brand of empathy and nurturing acceptance to children, as well as to the elderly and disabled.



Little Troopers



The Little Troopers Fund is a special program dedicated to raising money for treatable dogs and cats that are in urgent need of medical care. Through the Little Troopers Fund, H.A.L.O. foster animals with special needs obtain the care they would not otherwise receive.

As an animal rescue organization, H.A.L.O. takes in a variety of animals that make great companions for their human counterparts. While many of these animals are healthy, some dogs and cats that come into the program are in physical duress or have existing health problems. Little Trooper Fund enables H.A.L.O. to provide these animals with a second chance.

Here are two of our current Little Troopers:

Meet Blondie - (aka miss dirty face)

She came to us having seizures, at least two a day. They last a couple of minutes, then five minutes later she is up and running the room! Super sweet, she loves to cuddle. We are working with the vet and running tests to try and find out more. We are hoping this is something she can outgrow, but that is not a guarantee. She has had multiple rounds of antibiotics, her eyes have cleared up a bit but not sure if they will get any better than this. We are not ready to give up on this little girl. More tests are needed. We are asking for donations to help cover costs of her past and future tests.

Meet our other little Trooper Willow

Willow was found tiny and alone in the wheel well of a truck. Luckily, a kind woman saved her, and called HALO. We took her in, weighing just 13 ounces. It was very apparent that she had a serious problem with her right eye.

A visit to the vet the next day resulted in the diagnosis of terrible infection, and the likelihood that the eve was gone, due to the amount of pus and swelling. A regime of twice a day antibiotics, and three times a day eye/wound care was started. Another visit to the vet did confirm that her eye was gone, and she would need surgery to remove what was left in the socket. Willow had several infections in the following

Once she reached 3 lbs, she was able to have her spay and eye surgeries.

She is now recovering, and doing great! She has a potential adopter, and can go to her new home, once she has her stitches out and is cleared by her vet.

Her treatments and surgery has added a large financial load to HALO.

We are asking for donations to help offset.

Willow is a sweet, loving girl who purrs in her sleep! She was never going to be denied the care she needed, and now has a wonderful life ahead.

A donation in any amount would be very much appreciated.











Vaccine Clinics

Furry Friends Food Relief Program (F.F.F.R.) started their outreach program in hopes to help stop the overpopulation of animals in the shelters. They help curb this issue by helping owners at the beginning, when they may feel that they need to surrender their furry friend for some of the common financial or behavioral issues. These unfortunate circumstances may include; unable to afford pet food, medical care, spaying and neutering and various other financial reasons. What to bring:

- Pet vaccine records (if you have it)
- Pet spay/neuter certificate (if you have it)

Their food pantry, thrift store and spay/neuter assist, is open Mon, Tues, Thurs, Friday, 1-5pm. At 516 W. 2nd St, Antioch. Vaccine clinics are every 4 weeks. Please check our calendar.


