Marsh Creek Kitties

In July local resident Annette was approached by her neighbor and a discussion came to light that he was feeding several cats and kittens on his property. Wanting to lend assistance and help curb the overpopulation issue, Annette reached out to her friend, Renee, a long time H.A.L.O. volunteer, in hopes that together they could attempt to evaluate the cats and kittens on the property and come up with a plan. Once they arrived they discovered that there were 60 cats and kittens in various states of neglect and realized that this situation needed to be addressed immediately.

Annette, H.A.L.O. and local TNR advocate Lisa Kirk went to work to try and humanely trap all the cats and kittens. Through weeks of long days of over triple digit temperatures and hard work they were able to trap 20 adult cats and get them spayed/neutered and any medical attention they required. One of the adults had a severe eye infection and unfortunately had to have its eye removed. However an unfortunate surgery, it was actually very fortunate for the cat as it would have continued to suffer in extreme pain had the issue never been addressed. After being spayed/neutered all of the adult cats were returned back to the property where they will be allowed to live out their lives being fed and no longer able to reproduce.

As well as the 20 adult cats, they also humanely trapped 40 kittens. The health of the kittens ranged from, eye infections, upper respiratory infections, matted fur, parasite infested tummies, flea infestation and different levels of starvation caused by the mothers being too young and too malnourished to feed their kittens.

The last kitten that surfaced was a very tiny, runty kitten that ultimately needed to be bottle fed. This baby was extremely constipated and H.A.L.O. foster Renee, administered enemas and other supportive care to try and help ease this little babies discomfort. It turned out that this kitten had been so starved it was eating anything in sight to try and fight for its life. Found in the kittens stool was lots of twigs, leaves and dirt. Through tender loving care this kitten, named Twiggy, is now thriving.

All the kittens were taken in by H.A.L.O. fosters and some members of the community. They spent many hours caring for these kittens, administering medications, and taking them back and forth to the vet appointments. Sadly due to poor health 4 of these little guys did not make it. H.A.L.O. has spent over \$5,000 for vet visits, medications, general care and supplies for all of these kittens to get them healthy and ready for adoption.

The communities response to hearing through social media about this tragic situation has been tremendous.

H.A.L.O., as a result, has received monetary donations, food, medical supplies, and words of encouragement. Many of these kittens are being adopted.

We truly can not thank Annette enough for all she has done to be the voice for all these cats and kittens. We would also like to send a huge THANK YOU to every single person who made monetary donations as well as donating the important supplies it takes to bring babies like these back to health. We truly appreciate all the support the community has shown.

Meet Some of Our Marsh Creek Little Troopers

Twiggy

This is Twiggy. The last tiny kitten that was pulled from the hoard. Arriving at 6 am to check traps, he was found sitting quietly next to a non-lactating adult cat that was in a trap.

He was skin & bones and was immediately put on a bottle to try and help him gain weight. This is the little guy we referenced earlier that was starving and eating twigs and dirt. Experienced HALO fosters (Renee & Brittany), managed to pull several twigs from the rectum of Twiggy using tweezers. Due to the amounts of inedible material in Twiggy's intestines this poor baby was extremely constipated. But with the endless efforts of our fosters, he has pulled through.

Besides some setbacks, Twiggy continues to get stronger each and every day and we hope to place him in his forever home soon. According to his foster mom, "Twiggy loves people. He greets everyone that comes in our house. He also enjoys playing with other kittens and of course sleeping with his big brother. Twiggy is now a healthy 1 lb. 13oz. bundle of energy."



Pumpkin & Cinnamon

These little guys were found to have Cerebellar Hypoplasia. A cat with CH often falls down and has trouble walking or cannot seem to walk at all. Cerebellar Hypoplasia in cats is non-progressive, meaning it does not get worse with age. Cerebellar Hypoplasia occurs when the cerebellum, the part of the brain which controls fine motor skills and coordination, is not completely mature at birth.

Foster mom Sandy was determined to get these 2 adopted together. According to Sandy, "my husband said the only way you will let these 2 go is if the potential adopters walk-on-water". We are happy to say that they found that family and Pumpkin & Cinnamon have a wonderful new forever home with an experienced CH adopter.

Importance of TNR

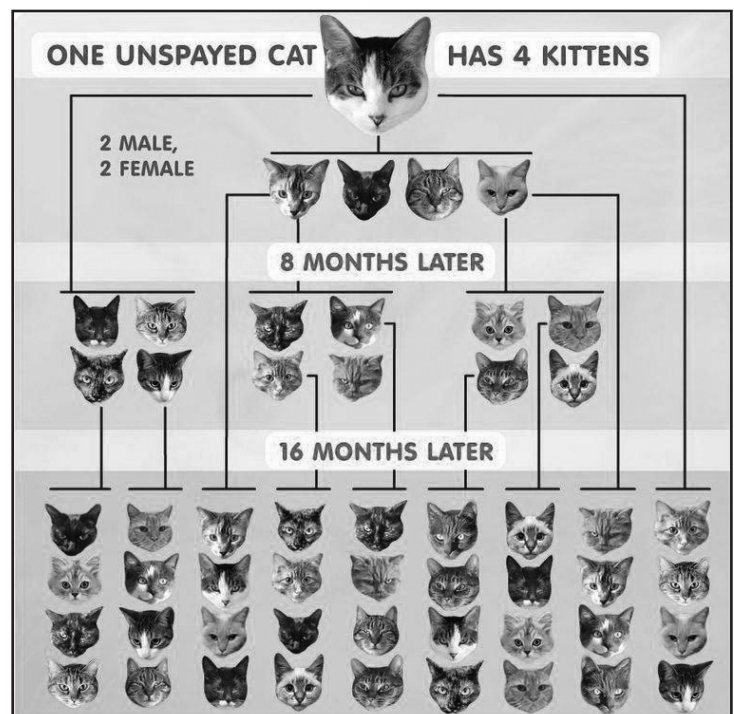
TNR involves humanely trapping feral cats living in cities, towns and rural areas and transporting them to a veterinary clinic where they are spayed or neutered. They may also receive a health check, vaccinations, and can be treated for routine medical conditions.

Unaltered community cats is a huge problem throughout East Contra Costa County and all around the world.

A single pair of cats and their kittens can produce a shocking amount of as many as 420,000 kittens in just 7 years!

Unfortunately, not spaying and neutering is the biggest reason why shelters and rescues are so overrun with kittens. "The Mercury News" writes that out of 14,000 animals our county shelter takes in each year, 68% of those are euthanized. The highest majority being cats. We can help ease this crisis by making sure any animal; be it family pet, stray or feral are spayed/neutered.

"East County Spay and Neuter assistance line" helps assist caregivers with low-cost spay/neuter of community cats and pet cats. Meet Our Angel Ears Team!

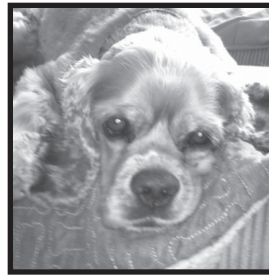
Angel Ears began as a means of promoting humane education, adoption of rescue dogs and for the provision of supportive intervention by Registered Therapy Dogs to the community of children, disabled and the elderly. In 2006, several H.A.L.O. volunteers and their canine pals, all rescue dogs with stories of their own, committed to becoming registered therapy teams and R.E.A.D. trained.

Since that time, Angel Ears Reading Education Assistance Dog (R.E.A.D) teams have volunteered in eight East County libraries to work with children who can benefit in their quest to become better readers by having a four-pawed, furry, non-judgmental reading buddy. Angel Ears teams have provided their own warm 'n fuzzy brand of empathy and nurturing acceptance to children, as well as to the elderly and disabled.

She has earned a Canine Good Citizen Award from AKC; has been a registered therapy dog for four years and a Registered R.E.A.D. dog for two years. 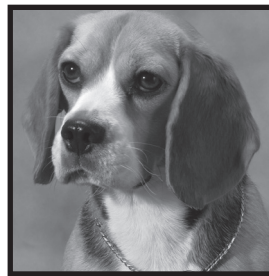
Maggie

East Bay Outreach Program Works to Keep Pets and Owners Together

Furry Friends Food Relief Program (F.F.F.R.) started their outreach program in hopes to help stop the overpopulation of animals in the shelters. They help curb this issue by helping owners at the beginning, when they may feel that they need to surrender their furry friend for some of the common financial or behavioral issues. These unfortunate circumstances may include; unable to afford pet food, medical care, spaying and neutering and various other financial reasons. Other reasons for considering surrendering animals to the shelter are behavioral issues that may just need a helping hand.

FFFR wants pet owners to know that there is help out there. They work to do all that they can to help families keep their beloved animals out of the shelters. They assist struggling families and the homeless in the Contra Costa County with FREE dog and cat food. Often times they find that those families need a bit more for their Furry Friend(s), such as bedding, leashes, collars, clothing ect., and they work to help provide that as well.

One of their goals is to help families in need and the homeless in Contra Costa County be able to afford their pets health care. The first step to that is affordable vaccines and a resource for spay and neuter. They currently have a FREE Spay/Neuter program called "Hands Helping Paws" for those who qualify. For those that do not qualify they can provide information about low income options, especially for pit bulls and chihuahuas which are so readily available and accessible in the east bay.

FFFR provides vaccine clinics every 4 weeks, run solely by volunteers.

Vaccine clinics are held at their office located at 1300 Central Blvd #E, Brentwood. On the day of the vaccine clinic registration begins at 10:00am and ends at 11:00am or the first 80 people, whichever comes first. Depending on available supplies, registration may end early based on the number of animals attending that day.

There is NO income guidelines to attend. They are only asking \$5 per vaccine, \$10 per flea treatment and \$10 per microchip, to be able to sustain the clinics future. FFFRs mission is to return to having the clinics at no cost to the clients in the future.

Vaccine Clinics are year round. Upcoming Clinics will be held on the following dates: Sept 24th, Oct 22nd, Nov 19th, Dec 17th.



Hot Rods 4 Paws is coming into it's 4th year. It is the biggest fundraiser for FFFR. It's a great family fun event with lots of vendors, kids zone, Pet costume contest and live entertainment and don't forget the amazing cars.

F.F.F.R. also has its own pet Thrift store! They offer the public access to pet toys, treats, leashes, crates, cleaners, gifts, most all pet related items at a discounted price. All items are donated and 100% of the proceeds directly supports those in need at Furry Friends Food Relief. The Thrift store is located at 1300 Central Blvd #E, Brentwood. FFFR pet thrift store is open Mon, Tue, Thur, Fri 1:00-5:00pm and Wed 1:00-8:00pm.

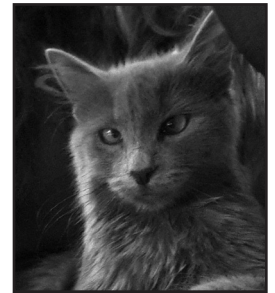

Cindy, Ed and Cynthia invited Macy to live at their cat sanctuary, offering a home when nobody else would. Fat Kitty City is a wonderful two-acre haven for cats, providing them with love, food, shelter and protection. This non-profit sanctuary is run by volunteers, funded mostly by donations. If Macy never gets adopted, I know she will be well cared for in her new forever home.



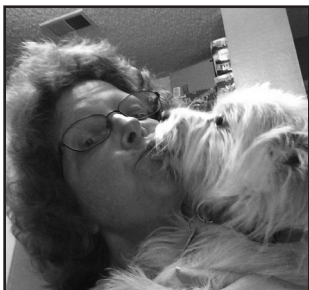
Fosters Needed!
